

**SOUTHEAST MONMOUTH MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY
MEETING MINUTES**

August 7, 2025

The Southeast Monmouth Municipal Utilities Authority members met on August 7, 2025. They have been collaborating with NJWSA to amend basis of design and improvements.
